Jayne graduated from Southwest High School in St. Louis and then sought adventures around the country. Upon returning to St. Louis, Jayne married, started a family and began a career. Jayne's spark made it easy to make and sustain friendships; with some made in kindergarten lasting her lifetime and others appreciating Jayne's way for making life fun and interesting.

Jayne had a passion for community service. Supporting her children's interests, Jayne served on the Board of Directors of the St. Louis Civic Ballet; as Team Manager for Junior League Football and Little League Baseball teams for the many years her sons played and as Cheerleading Coordinator for those teams.
