



Dr. Jiasan Fu

February 24, 1956 - May 28, 2019

On February 24, 1956, Jiasan Fu was born in the city of Chengdu in the Sichuan province of China. His parents were two prominent medical doctors. He and his two older sisters spent their formative years in Xining, Qinghai. Although Jiasan and his sisters grew up during the Cultural Revolution, his parents taught him to focus on his education and particularly on his English. He followed their footsteps into medicine and attended medical school in Shanghai where he was able to learn from renowned professors. In 1981, after practicing medicine for a few years in Qinghai, Jiasan passed an extremely selective national exam for overseas postgraduate education. He qualified to study in the United States.

In 1982, Jiasan began his graduate studies in pharmacology at Tulane University and Louisiana State University where received his master's and doctorate degrees respectively. Excited about the prospect of practicing medicine in this country, he entered the University of Kentucky in Lexington Medical School and received his M.D. in 1996. He completed his residency in internal medicine at Barnes-Jewish Hospital in St. Louis, a city he would come to call home. Here, he served as one of the first hospitalists in the nation within the IPC group for 15 years. He was also well known in the Forest Park Hospital, where he also worked in the emergency department, and the St. Joseph Hospitals in Kirkwood and Lake St. Louis.

He was known for his medical diagnostic skills, his tireless dedication to his patients, and kindness to his colleagues. Jiasan had kind heart and playful spirit and was always there for those who needed him. In addition to working tirelessly to help his patients and community, he was a dedicated father, loving husband, and devoted son. He had a passion for travel and instilled this sense of adventure in his family by taking them on various trips around the world. He is survived by his devoted wife Xuan Dong, his children Josh and Victoria Fu, his sisters Dadin and Yiguang Fu, and their children Henry, Jiayang, and Jonathan.

He is no longer suffering after an intense battle with cancer, which he faced with incredible strength, resilience, and dignity. His legacy lives on in the hearts of those who loved him and whom he loved. He will be forever missed, never forgotten.

傅佳三于1956年出生在中国四川成都的一个医生家庭，1960年他四岁时随家庭迁到青海西宁，在那里度过了童年和青少年时期。在学校全面停课教育中断的文革特殊年代，他陆续坚持文化学习。他于1974年进入上海第二医学院医学系，毕业后即在上海瑞金医院进修，期间受到过徐家裕、王振义等几位著名教授的教诲。他后来在青海医学院附属医院内科做临床医生。1981年他通过了教育部的出国研究生考试，获得赴美读研究生的资格。他还参加了中国第一次TOEFL 考试和GRE考试，于1982年来到美国。

来美后，傅佳三先后在 Tulane 大学和路易斯安那州立大学获得药理学硕士和博士学位，1992年他进入 Kentucky 大学医学院，1996年获得美国医学博士学位，并在 Barnes-Jewish Hospital完成内科住院医师训练，成为IPC公司在全美范围内的首批住院病人临床医生之一，他从1999年10月开始在 这家公司属下的医院工作直到两年前退休。他在 Forest Park 医院、St. Joseph Hospital in Kirkwood 和St. Joseph Hospital at Lake St. Louis 都是被人熟知和爱戴的医

生。他以自己的医疗诊断技能，对病人的不懈奉献以及对护士和同事们的友善而被人称道。在他行医早年还做过急诊科医生。

傅佳三本性忠厚善良，乐于助人，他为人谦和，是圣路易斯很多华人的挚友，是大家公认的好人。他热爱家人，孝敬父母，关心亲人，是个好丈夫，好父亲，好儿子，他的辞世令人万分不舍，如今他不再受到病痛的折磨，愿他在天国安息！
